ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Note: *This form is meant for students interested in securing admission at A Level_55 main Gulberg (Girls only) campus. *

Registration Process begins on Tuesday, May 2, 2022. Last date of registration will be Saturday, July 30, 2022. Classes for A1 commence on Tuesday, August 9, 2022.

Online Admission Process:

- Step 1: Download the A Level Registration Fee Bill (LGS students exempted) from our website, deposit fee in the relevant bank, scan paid slip and convert into a pdf doc.
- Step 2: Download the 'A Level Payment Policy', print, sign, scan and convert into pdf doc.
- Step 3: Complete the Application Form on-line and submit the following documents as PDF (NOT jpeg/any other):
 - Final exam result of Class 10 & last exam result of Grade 11 from previous school
 - ii. O' Level result (if any)
 - iii. Scanned copy of paid Registration Fee Bill; LGS students exempted
 - iv. Scanned signed off 'Agreement of A Level Payment Policy' document with Parents' CNIC (front & back)
 - vi. Students NADRA Smart Card (front & back)
 - vii. Recent passport size photograph with a white background.

Please note that incomplete applications will not be processed.

- It is mandatory for all students to email complete O Level result within TWO DAYS of announcement by the respective Board/s.
- Written Tests:

The following students will be required to sit for a test at the commencement of classes (a week after the Orientation Session):

- i. Comprehension (for students opting for Literature in English or English Language)
- ii. IT (for students who have not done Computer Science/IT in O Level).
- iii. Art & Design (for students who did not take Art in O Level)
- iv. Media Studies (for all students opting for the subject).
- v. Global Perspectives (for students who have not studied Global Perspectives in O Level)
- A Level Office will schedule the interviews with the candidate and/s parent/s after receipt of <u>complete</u> uploaded documents.
- The selected candidates will be issued an Admission Offer Letter along with first bill. If the fee is not paid before /at the due date, the admission will automatically stand revoked and the seat may be offered to another candidate.







One of the most integral features of the extracurricular programme at 55 Main is the Asian Regional Space Settlement Design Competition held by NASA.
